Accessibility Statement

This Accessibility Plan covers the period from October 2023 to August 2026. The plan is available in large print or other accessible formats if required.

The plan takes account of the statutory equality duty set out in Section 149 of the Equality Act 2010.

We are further committed to challenging attitudes about disability and accessibility and to developing a culture of awareness, tolerance and inclusion.

Background/Scope

The School Site & Facilities

Cleve House International School & Preschool is committed to making reasonable adjustments to allow disabled students to access our educational provision. The School occupies a four-story building built in the early 1900s. The school is currently accessible to everyone, without requiring any adjustments for our current needs.

The second floor is accessible via 3 sets of stairs.

We plan, over time, to increase the accessibility of provision for all pupils, staff and visitors to the Academy in the following areas:

- increase the extent to which disabled pupils can participate in the School curriculum
- improve the physical environment of the Academy to increase access to education for disabled pupils
- improve the delivery of information to pupils, staff, parents and visitors with disabilities

Attached is an action plan relating to the above. This will be reviewed as and when necessary. It is acknowledged that there will be need for ongoing awareness training for all staff in the matter of disability discrimination and the potential need to inform attitudes on this matter.
